Just to keep the rest of us in our place (or our market niche), in 2005 California reported an average yield of 30 tons per acre on 34,300 acre for a total production of over 2 billion pounds.

Detritus removal in Blackberries: From one of our contributors: "Now would be a good time to do brushing on blackberries, not much (if any) growth yet. The ground is dry enough but, if possible wait for low humidity. It works a lot better when it is drier. Should be no problems brushing into the middle of February... Some growers just move in the beaters on their harvester, remove the catch plates, and don't bother with the brushes. It does a pretty good job, especially if you do it twice. The second pass will knock off material that has been loosened."

Phytophthora Testing available free of charge for Washington Red Raspberry Growers: If you are interested in having either pre-plant propagules or field samples tested for Phytophthora root rot, contact [Colleen Burrows](#) or Craig MacConnell at WSU Whatcom County Extension (360) 676-6736 or, in Clark or Cowlitz counties, [Tom Peerbolt](#) at 503-970-0922. Free, with on farm sampling and pick up all done for you. Results will be posted anonymously (by grower generated codes) on the WSU Whatcom County website. This is a research project funded by the Washington State Commission for Pesticide Registrations and the Washington Red Raspberry Commission to test the effectiveness of newly implemented PCR testing techniques.

Chemical Control Update:

Fungicide, blueberries: A supplemental label has been issued for the use of **Indar** for mummyberry control in blueberries. [Click here](#) for a copy of the label. This is great news—no more need for our annual application for an emergency Section 18 label.

Disease Information

Pseudomonas (Bacterial Blight) blueberries: Water-soaked lesions are appearing on canes in some fields that then develop into a **reddish brown to black cankers**. Cankers may extend from a fraction of an inch to the entire length of 1-year-old wood. Buds in cankers die. If girdled, the cane portion above the canker dies.
